Take brawne of swyne, perboyle hit wele,  
And grynde hit smalle, Syr, everydele;  
With Ȓolkes of eyren Ȓou schalle hit lye,  
Set hit over Ȓe fyre for-Ȓye,  
Put whyte grece Ȓerto, bewar, iwys,  
Let hit not sethe lest Ȓou mys.  
Do Ȓer to powder and safron penne  
And messe hit forthe before goode menne;  
Powder dowce Ȓeron Ȓou kast  
Stondande at dressore on Ȓe last.

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*Conyngus in cyne*<sup>1</sup>.

Smyte Ȓe conyngus in pese smalle;  
And sethe hom in brothe gode Ȓou sballe;  
Mynsyn onyons in grece Ȓou sethe,  
And in good brothe, pat is so smethe  
Walle togeder; and drauȒe alioure  
Of blode and brede sumdele sowre,
