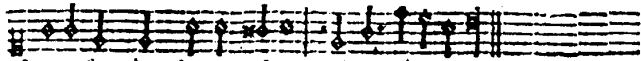

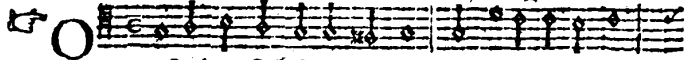

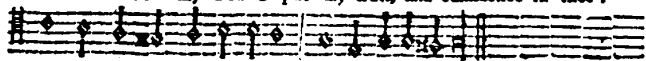

mine honour in the dust.

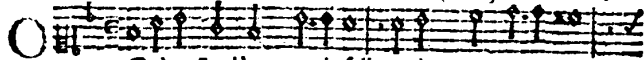
6 Start vp O Lord now in thy wrath,

thy selfe as Lord and King.

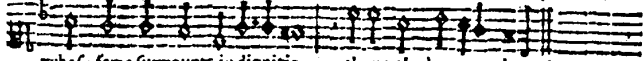
8 And thou that art: of all men Iudge

vvhilſt he doth mischief vvarpe.

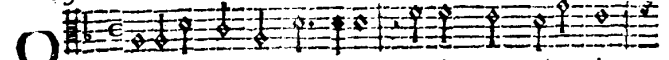
15 But loe though he in trauell be

that he digde vp for other.

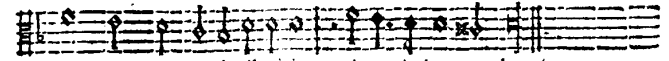
17 Thus vvrong returneth to the hurt

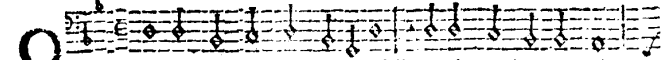

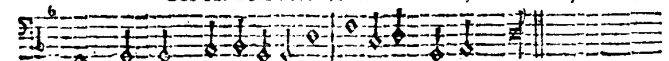
