Fer more and more they did delire, to ferue their lufts and vvils. 30 But as the meat was in their mouths, his verath upon them fell: 31 Andflew the flower of all their youth and choife of Ifrael.

and fill they did him grieue:
For all the wronders that he wwonght, they would not him believe. 33 Their dayes therefore he shortened. and made their honour vaine: Theiryceres did waft and paffe avvay. with terror and with paine.

32 Yet fell they to their wented finne.

34 But euer vohen he plagued them they fought him by and by: Remembringthar he was their firength, their help and godmon hie.

35 Though in their mouthes they did but and flatter with the Lord : And with their tongues & in their harts diffembled every vvord.

6 Forwhy: their hearts vvere nothing to him, nor to his trade: Nor yet to keepe or to performe the conenant that was made.

37 Yet was hee fill fo merciful, when they deserved to dye: That he forgaue them their misteeds, and yould not them defroy.

38 Yea many a time he turnde his wrath and did himselfe aduise : And would not fuffer all his whole displeasure to atile. 39 Confidering that they were but flesh,

and even as a vvinde That paffethavvay, and cannot well returne by his owne kinde.

40 Hovy often times in vvilderneffe did they the Lord prouoke 5 Hovy did they fir and moue the Low

to plague them with his fitoke § at Yet did they turne againe to final and tempted God eltfoone, Prescribing to the holy Lord what things they would have done. 41 Not thinking of his hand and power;

nor of the day when he Delinered them out of the hands of the fierce enemie. 43 Nor hovy he vyrought his miracles

as they themselues beheld In Egypt, and the wonders that he did in Zoan field.

44 Nor hove he turned by his power their vvaters into bloud: That no man might receive his drinke at river or at floud. 45 Nor how he fent them swarmes of

which did them fore annoy: (I And fild their country full of Frogs which did their land deftroy.

46 Nor how he did commit their fruits Into the Caterpiller: And all the labour of their hands he gaue to the Grashopper. 47 VVith hailstones he destroid their (vines Sothat they where all loft: And not so much as wilde Fig-trees but he confumde with froft.

48 And yet with hailstones once againe the Lord their cattell fmote And all their flocks & heards likewise with thunderbolts full hot. 49 He cast upon them in his ire and in his fury strong Displeasure, verath and euill spirits to trouble them among.

50 Then to his werath hemade a vvay, and spared not the leaft; But gaue vnto the pestilence

Vithout all feare both safe & sound he brought them out of thrall : Whereas their fo s with rage of lea yvere oueryvhelmed all

54 And brought them out into the coaffe of his ovene holy land:

Even to the mount which he had got by his firong arme and hand. 55And theze cast out the heathen folke,

and did their land divide : And in their tents he fet the tribes of Israel to abid :.

36 Yet for all this their God moft hye they fird and tempted fill : Andyvould not keepe his testament, mer yet obay his vvill. 37 But as their fathers turned backe,

euen fo they went aftray Much like a bowy that would not bend, but flip andftart avvay.

59 Therewithhis werath began againe to kindle in his breaft : The naughrinesse of Israel

he did fo much deteft. 60 Then he forfooke the Tabernacle

of Silo, where he was Right connerfant with earthly men euen as his develling place

61 Then suffered he his might & povver inbondage for to stand:

And gaue the honor of his Arke into his enemies hand.

62 And did commit them to the fovord wroth with his heritage:

53 The yong men overe denourde with

Maideshad no marriage. 64 And with the fovere the prices also

did perish enery one:
And nors vyiddovy left aliue their death for to bemone.

65 And then the Lordbegan to wake like one that flept atime: And as a valiant man of vvar refreshed after wine.

66 VVith Emreds in their hinder parts he strake his enemies all; And put them then vnto a shame that was perpetuall.

67 Then he the tent and tabetnacle of Loseph did refuse: As for thetribe of Ephraim he would in no wrife chufe. 68 But chose the tribe of lehuds, whereas he meant to dwveli: Euen the noble Mount Sion,

which he did love so well 69 VVhereas he did his Temple build both fumptuoufly and fure Like as the earth which he hathmade for ever to endure.

70 Then chose he David him to serue his people for to keepe : VVhich he tooke vp and brought avvay, euen from the folds of sheepe.

71 As he did followy the Evves with the Lord did him advance: To feed his people Ifrael and his inheritance.

72 Thus David with a faithfull beart, hisflock and charge did feed: And prudently with all his power did governe them indeed.
