

If there were, for Example, a finking Mark upon a half Pofition, it would shew, that the Knee of that Leg only was to be bent; but if finking Marks should be on the whole Position, then both Knees are to be bent at the same time. The same is to be observed for Rising, Springing, &c. The Marks on the Positions, have no appointed Place, as they have on Steps, excepting Points, which are to be placed in the same manner as on Steps.



## Of Positions and half Positions having feveral Marks at once.

Ossitions and half Positions may have several Marks together, as Steps have; and it must be observed of the Marks for Sinking, Rising, Springing, and Capers, that the Mark placed nearest to the o, is what must be first made; but when there is the Mark for the Foot up, that must certainly be the last performed.
