Ownsbefore I did in the former, win this Measure alfo have I observed divers absurdityes committed, by not distinguishing the Lesse Prolation from his Diminutions.

For vnto this Time and Prolation there pertaines a 2. folde Diminution (by(1) some termed Semi-dity) the Greater,

and the Leffer.

The G-enter Diminution is rightly thus Charactered(2) Tor (by Retort of the aforelayd Imperfest Circle) thus I sthough divers there be, that from the Proportionate Rule (forfooth) will have it thus C 2. but for as much as in this Measure there is vs'd no Denigration, and all Proportions are out of vse save Sesqui-altera, I have sayd sufficiently for consultation thereof, before.

Vnder this Diminution are compos'd Almayns, Free Mens Songs, Ayres and such like, and (accordingly) among our Minstrells, 'tis knowne by the name of Almayne Time, and is as a Duple to the Lesse Prolation; that is, a Motion as swift againe, as the Lesse Prolation is of, in his owne Naturali

The Lesse Diminution we finde to bee thus Character'a(3) †, or with Retort of the Great Diminution thus (4) D; and this is the swiftest Motion that vnder this Measure is Composid; and such are all those Compositions which are vnder it, as liegs, and the like.

But heerein now the Ignorance of our times is such, notknowing the differences of this Imperfect Prolation and the Diminutions therof, that they commonly Charactere-he Church Songs, and Mostets, with the Greater Diminution thus C; according whereunto if those Songs should be sung, it would not only alter the nature of those Harmonies, but also make them seeme rather some Dauncing or Reuelling Mensure, then a religious Note to be vsed in Gods Service.
