5 VVhete thirk and hunger vvas fo great in those desarts so voyde : That faintnesse did them fore Mault, and eke their foule anneide. 6 Thea did they cry in their diffresse vnto the Lord for ayder VVbo did remoue their troublous Rate

7 And by that way that was most right heled them like a guide:

according as they praied.

That they might to a citic goe, and there also abide.

for gracious is hee:

And

3 Let men therefore before the Lotal confesse his kindnesse then: And shevy his younders that he doth before the founes of men.

9 For he the empty foule fusiaind, whom thirst had made to faint: The hungry foule with goodneffe fed, and did them eke acquaint. To Such as doe devell in darkneffe deepe


where they of death doe wayte Fast bound to tak such troubleus forme as iron chaines doe threat.



The third part. 21 Let men therefore before the Lord, confesse his kindnesse then : And shew the evonders that he doth beforethe sonnes of men. 22 And let them offer facrifice with thanks and also feare: And speake of all his wondrous works, with glad and loyfull cheere.
