
The Art of Dancing.

Sides of the Page, the four Sides of the Room, viz. the upper part of the Page, reprefents the upper end of the Room; the lower part, the lower end; the right fide of the Page, the right fide of the Room; and the left fide, the left, as you may fee by the following Figure, of which A B C D reprefent the Room, and E F G H, the Page. E F shew the upper part of the Page, as C D do the lower end; F H the right fide of the Page, as B D the right fide of the Room; and E G the left fide of the Page, as A C the left fide of the Room.



You must observe always to hold the upper end of the Book against the upper end of the Room; and whether the Dance have any Turning in it or not, you must carefully avoid removing the Book from the Scituation above demonstrated.

When any Steps are made without turning, or in turning quite round, then both fides of the Book must be held with both Hands; but in turning a quarter round, half round, or three quarters round, it will be necessary to take more Care, because
